The course explores the legal regulation of sex and sexuality as well as how and why law takes an interest in sex and sexuality, including the lines that law has historically drawn between legitimate and illegitimate, 'normal' and 'abnormal' sexual practices, representations and identities. The course considers law's role in both constituting and regulating sex, sexuality and sexual diversity and analyzes the role of different types of legal regulation, including constitutional law, criminal law, and family law
