SDS256H1 – Social Scientific Approaches to Sexuality

This course – the compliment to UNI255H1 (History and Perspectives on Sexuality) – will introduce students to a social sciences approach to the study of sexuality; particularly from an anthropological and sociological perspective, as a way of understanding sexual diversity across societies. Students will be exposed to a number of key issues and debates concerning social scientists interested in the study of sexuality, including, but not limited to, the social construction of “sex”, “gender”, and “sexuality”, the Feminist Sex Wars, same-sex sexualities, trans issues, BDSM, and sexuality and globalization.
