By the end of the semester, students will have a strong background in both general trans issues as well as the ways that trans issues effect and are part of students' own lives and lived spaces and contexts. Individualized final projects will provide students with the opportunity to focus on and learn about specific communities, actions, or issues most relevant to their own interests and trajectories and our projects will deepen our common understanding of trans people, communities, and issues.
