**SDS455H1 – Sexuality & Health**

This interdisciplinary course will offer a critical examination of how the idea of “ethics” is understood and deployed in research on sexuality and health. Emphases will be on exploring the ways in which discourses of “risk,” “precarity” and “cure” become biopolitical frameworks that limit our understandings of health and advocacy in sexual minoritarian communities and populations locally and globally. Students will engage with various scholarly and activist literatures from Critical Disability Studies, Youth and Educational Studies, Critical Development Studies, and Critical Race Theory.
